
THERE ARE THREE ADDITIONAL IDENTIFICATION OPTIONS:**1. Visible Identification by an Election Officer**

- An elector's identity can be confirmed by a Deputy Returning Officer or Poll Clerk working at a polling station.
- A notation must be made in column 10 of the Poll Book stating, "Elector's identity confirmed by Mary Poppins, Deputy Returning Officer."
- An election officer can confirm the identities of multiple electors (as many as necessary).

2. Guarantor's Form (AS-23)

- This form allows the elector's identity to be confirmed by a friend, relative, etc. (someone who knows the elector). The Guarantor must complete the "Guarantor's Form" and must also produce identification of his/her own.
- A person, other than an election officer, can act as a Guarantor only **once**.
- A Guarantor does not have to be from or live in the same district as the elector.
- The elector whose identity is being guaranteed must complete form P-6 and must also swear/affirm/declare the related oath.
- A notation must be made in column 10 of the Poll Book stating, "Elector's identity confirmed by a Guarantor – Bill Nye." Be sure to include the Guarantor's name so election officers can ensure that he or she does not guarantee the identity of another elector.

3. Affidavit for Identification (AS-24)

- The elector must complete form AS-24, swearing, affirming or declaring that he or she has absolutely no documentation to support his or her identity.
- This form must be witnessed by an official, such as a Barrister or Commissioner for Oaths.
- The official does not have to know the elector, or reside in the same electoral district as the elector.
- The elector must also complete form P-6 and swear/affirm/declare the related oath.
