

Copies of acceptable identification must accompany the Oath/ Affirmation / Declaration of Elector for Addition, Update or Removal on the Official List of Electors (VR-21).

Examples of acceptable identification provided in the table below are not exhaustive. Other documents or combinations of documents may be acceptable providing they validate the elector's name, current residence address and signature.

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If an elector is unable to provide copies of acceptable identification to accompany Form VR-21 as referenced in these guidelines then there are two additional options.

**1. Guarantor's Form (VR-23)**

- This form allows the elector's identity to be confirmed by a friend, relative or individual who can verify the elector and the elector's ordinary residence.
- The Guarantor must complete the "Guarantor's Form" (VR-23) form.
- Copies of acceptable identification that validate the identity of the Guarantor must accompany the "Guarantor's Form" (VR-23) form.
- A person, other than an election officer, can act as a Guarantor only **once**.
- A Guarantor does not have to be from or live in the same district as the elector.

**2. Affidavit for Identification (VR-24)**

- The elector must complete the "Affidavit for Identification", (VR-24) form, swearing, affirming or declaring that he or she has absolutely no documentation to support his or her identity.
- The "Affidavit for Identification", (VR-24) form must be witnessed by an official, such as a Barrister; Mayor; Commissioner for Oaths; Justice of Peace or Notary Public.
- The official does not have to know the elector, or reside in the same electoral district as the elector.
