

Letter of Confirmation of Residence

You can use this letter as your proof of residence – along with a second piece of ID – to register and vote in a provincial election.

What you need to know:

- This proof of residence will be valid only if it is signed by the administrator of a shelter.
- If you live in or receive services from a shelter you may use this Letter of Confirmation of Residence from the administrator of the shelter.
- When you go to register and vote, bring this letter and a second piece of ID with your name, such as your MCP card. A complete list of acceptable ID is on our website.
