

Introduction

The Baie Verte – Green Bay by-election is the third election event that Elections NL has administered in 2024. Elections NL has focused on integrating a new Elections Management System into our operations to modernize both the service delivery of elections to electors, as well as the administrative functions of an election at our District Returning Offices and Headquarters.

Elections NL's new Election Management System allows electors in any electoral district to register or update their registration information with Elections NL using an online portal. Electors may also check to verify that their information is correct and make any changes. This registration portal is available on the Elections NL website at register.elections.gov.nl.ca.

For the Baie Verte – Green Bay by-election, Elections NL continued to pilot using technology at certain Advance Polling locations to demonstrate the capabilities of the Elections Management System as a registration and verification tool for election administration. Any updates to elector information were processed in real-time at the Advance Polling location, ensuring that an elector's information is current and up to date in the Elections NL registry.

Additionally, Elections NL continued to test satellite communications to facilitate the transmission of data from election officials in the field to the Election Management System and to Elections NL Headquarters. As Elections NL modernizes the administration of election events, establishing robust communication and delivery plans is necessary to ensure that improved electoral services can be deployed throughout the province for all electors.

The results from both pilot projects were successful. Elections NL was able to deliver contemporary services to electors in the district and demonstrate that these modernized services can be deployed using a variety of communication networks.

While Elections NL did demonstrate the ability to use technology at Advance Polling locations, the Elections Act, 1991 is still highly prescriptive and in need of modification to permit modernized electoral services and electoral administrative functions. Without any amendment of the Elections Act, 1991 then Elections NL must continue to administer election events based on procedures and processes designed over 30 years ago.



By-Election Summary

On Monday, February 26, 2024, Brian Warr, the Liberal Member for the electoral district of Baie Verte - Green Bay, announced the resignation of his seat as of Friday, March 1, 2024 resulting in a vacancy in the House of Assembly.

A proclamation was issued on Sunday, April 28, 2024 pursuant to Order in Council Number and the Chief Electoral Officer issued a writ of election to the Baie Verte - Green Bay Returning Officer, Catherine Chazalon.

The by-election date was set for Monday, May 27, 2024. The following key dates and deadlines were in effect for the by-election:

Official Addition of the Votes (3 days after Election Day)

A complete listing of key dates and deadlines (**Appendix A**) in effect for the by-election are included in this report.

At the time of the by-election call, the distribution of seats in Newfoundland and Labrador was 22 Liberal Members; 12 Progressive Conservative Members; three New Democratic Members; two Independent Members and one vacancy.

Lin Paddock, the Progressive Conservative candidate, was declared elected as the Member of the House of Assembly for Baie Verte - Green Bay.

The electoral district of Baie Verte - Green Bay has 9,602 eligible electors in the district. The distribution of votes during the by-election was as follows:

- Total Votes Cast – 5,402
- Special Ballots – 582 (10.8%)
- Advance Votes – 761 (14.1%)
- Regular Votes – 4,059 (75.1%)
- Represents 56.3% turnout

Expenditures on the Baie Verte - Green Bay by-election were \$192,100, exclusive of grants and subsidies. Salaries and Wages to Election Officials accounted for \$126,800 of the expenditures. Travel amounted to \$10,200 and \$55,100 was for Purchased Services, rentals and other election expenses.

Procedural and Administrative Changes for the Baie Verte - Green Bay By-Election

Technology

1. Special Ballot Portal

To improve access and efficiency of Special Ballot voting Elections NL used the Election Management System's Special Ballot portal for processing online Special Ballot applications. The portal allows electors to upload identification and complete an online application for a Special Ballot kit. Electors could also apply for a Special Ballot in-person application at the Returning Office or at Elections NL headquarters. Election Officials would also record any in-person application within the Special Ballot Portal, providing real-time information about the volume and status of Special Ballot kits throughout the by-election.

2. Advance Poll Strike off

During Advance Voting Elections NL tested live elector registration and a digital pollbook to record voter strike off at the polls. The live registration allowed Election Officials to update elector information on the list of electors while the elector was in front of them, ensuring that the elector's information was current and that they were eligible to vote in the by-election. The use of barcode scanning technology streamlined the process, making voting fast and efficient for electors and ensuring accurate updates to the voters list.

3. Satellite Communications

To ensure strong connectivity and no interruptions to the delivery of electoral services, Elections NL utilized satellite communications to conduct the real-time Advance Poll strike off. The use of satellite communications at the Advance Poll allowed for real time updates to elector information and the voters list at any location, regardless of the location's previous internet capabilities.

4. Voterview Election Management

For the Bay Verte - Green Bay by-election Elections NL used VoterView as the Election Management System to support the election administration. VoterView is an online, web-based platform. Users of the election management system include the Returning Officer, district office staff and head office staff. Voterview simplified the management of elector data and streamlined the ability to make corrections to the voters list, providing Elections NL with access to comprehensive election reports that streamline our processes and the allocation of resources to better serve electors in a more timely and efficient manner.

Voterview modernized administrative processes and digitized numerous forms, significantly reducing the amount of paper needed to administer an election event. The Voterview dashboard oversees all aspects of the election event, including locations and polls, enabling Elections NL to identify, anticipate and respond in a timely manner to issues, assuring the seamless delivery of services to electors. The integration of Voterview as Election NL's election management provides more efficient services to electors, candidates, and other stakeholders.

5. Special Ballot Office in Baie Verte

During the by-election, a Special Ballot Remote Office was opened in Baie Verte to serve electors in that community. Considerations that led to the decision to open the Special Ballot Office in Baie Verte were the distance between the communities of Baie Verte, La Scie and Springdale, the community of Baie Verte being a health and recreation centre for the district, and the commercial fishery activity during the by-election. This additional office offered a flexible voting alternative, including varied opening hours to accommodate those electors that could not vote in person at either the Advance Voting Day or Polling Day. With the implementation of the new Election Management System Elections NL has the ability to deploy connected Special Ballot offices with fewer administrative and material requirements than in previous events.

Boundaries and Polling Stations

The number of poll boundaries for the Baie Verte - Green Bay by-election were the same as those in the 2021 Provincial General Election. There was a total of 52 polling divisions in the district, comprised of 47 regular polling divisions, four Advance Polls and one Special Ballot poll.

A listing of the polling divisions and their boundary descriptions (**Appendix B**), along with a map of the electoral district showing the polling division boundaries (**Appendix C**), are included in this report.

Elections Officials

The Returning Officer, who manages the election at the district level, appoints an Election Clerk, an Election Assistant and two Special Ballot Officers. Together, they work in the district Returning Office to help administer the by-election. In the Baie Verte - Green Bay district, there was also a Special Ballot (Satellite) Office in Springdale with two Special Ballot Officers and a Special Ballot (Remote) Office in Baie Verte with a Special Ballot Officer. The Returning Officer is also responsible for hiring and training all election officials for their district. This includes everyone who will work in the polls: Deputy Returning Officers, Poll Clerks, Supervisors, Registration Clerks, Door Attendants, Parking Attendants, Messengers and Witnesses. The Returning Office also hires and trains the Special Ballot Officers who conduct the hospital and personal care home voting.

Candidate Registration and Nomination

At the time of the Baie Verte - Green Bay by-election there were three registered parties in the province: the Liberal Party, the New Democratic Party and the Progressive Conservative Party. Each of the three registered parties put forth a candidate by the 2:00pm deadline on Monday, May 6 2024.

Methods of Voting

Special Ballot Voting

Special Ballot applications were available to electors online or in person. Beginning on Tuesday, May 7, 2024, electors were able to vote by Special Ballot by mail or in person at the district Returning Office, at the Satellite Office in Springdale, at the Remote Office in Baie Verte, and at Elections NL headquarters.

A total of 601 Special Ballot applications were processed. 17 Special Ballots were not returned to Elections NL headquarters in time for the Special Ballot count procedure, resulting in a total of 584 Special Ballot votes being counted.

Advance Poll

Advance poll voting was held in the Baie Verte - Green Bay district on Tuesday, May 21, 2024 from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Advance voting took place in four locations.

- Over 14% of votes cast in the by-election were at the Advance Poll.

There were 5,402 valid ballots cast in the by-election. Over 75% of the votes were cast on Polling Day.

Elector Participation and Registration

The preliminary list of electors for Baie Verte - Green Bay, certified by the Chief Electoral Officer on April 30, contained a total of 9,480 registered electors. The list of electors is updated throughout the by-election through revision activities. These include direct communication with electors through our website, e-mail or the Elections NL contact centre, swear-ins during Advance Poll voting, as well as Special Ballot voting opportunities.

Voter Information Cards (VICs) were mailed to each elector on the preliminary list of electors prior to the beginning of the revision period. The distribution of these cards prompted electors to contact Elections NL to verify, update, remove or add their information on the voters list.

A final, revised list of electors was certified on May 22, 2024 and contained 9,602 electors. This list contained all revisions and updates of electors who voted at the Advance Poll and by Special Ballot and was used at all polling stations on Polling Day.

Official Addition of the Votes

In accordance with s. 153 of the **Elections Act, 1991**, the Official Addition of the Votes must take place three days after polling day. In the case of the Baie Verte - Green Bay By - Election, the Official Addition took place on Thursday, May 30, 2024 at 9:00 a.m. at the Returning Office in the presence of two required witnesses.

During the official addition process, the Returning Officer removes the Official Statement of the Poll sheets from each district ballot box and reviews them to ensure the accuracy of the calculation of vote totals

The conclusion of the Official Addition of the Votes confirmed the election of Progressive Conservative candidate, Lin Paddock.

Return of the Writ

Section 163(1) of the Elections Act, 1991 requires a waiting period of 12 clear days between the conclusion of the Official Addition and the return of the writ of election. This provides sufficient time for a candidate, voter, district officer or scrutineer to request a judicial recount. A recount was not requested in the Baie Verte - Green Bay by-election. As a result, the writ of election was returned to Elections NL on Tuesday, June 11, 2024 and the Progressive Conservative candidate, Lin Paddock, was sworn into office on Wednesday, June 26, 2024.

Observations and Recommendations by the Chief Electoral Officer

During this by-election Elections NL was able to successfully pilot modern voting management technology into the administrative operations of the by-election. This modernization of our processes allows electors to register and verify their information with Elections NL on the spot with a seamless integration into our electoral management system. As electors cast their vote our officials can record the elector as having voted in real time within our systems. This real-time delivery of information through the election management system ensures that Elections NL has the most current data available on who has voted, and that those who voted were eligible to do so, not only at the polling station, but in real-time at headquarters and at the Returning Office.

This ability to register and record electors in real-time is a significant milestone and crucial step forward towards delivering modernized electoral services, such as consecutive voting days, or a vote anywhere model in Newfoundland and Labrador. Modernized voting services require the deployment of technology to both administer voting and ensure the integrity of the vote. Elections NL now has the technological capacity to deliver modernized electoral services. Contemporary electoral services place less emphasis on Polling Day, instead they allow for more flexible and convenient voting opportunities for electors to exercise their right to vote.

As noted elsewhere in the report, the Elections Act, 1991 is quite prescriptive in how voting may occur in Newfoundland and Labrador, along with significant restrictions on how the administrative procedures should function. While Elections NL was able to pilot technology at the polls using the legislated paper process in parallel with technology during this by-election, the same could not be accomplished at scale for all electoral districts in a general election. The Elections Act, 1991 contemplates that all polling activities are conducted on tangible items such as poll books, paper forms, documents, and lists etc. It does not consider that items such as voters lists, or poll books could be in a digital format and accessible using technology at polling locations.

The Elections Act, 1991, due to its prescriptiveness, also limits the ability of any detailed analysis of polling activity. All polling activity at the Advance Polls and on Polling Day is recorded in physical poll books. The poll books are a record of who voted in each election. These poll books are sealed at the end of the night on polling day and remain sealed for a year after each election event, in accordance with the act. Section 164 of the Elections Act, 1991 specifies that the Chief Electoral Officer must report on the proceedings of an election within nine months of polling day and therefore that report does not contain any information that could be taken from an analysis of the poll books.

This would include information such as the age and gender of voters in an election, information regarding peak periods or locations of voting throughout polling day and potentially identifying any duplicate voting. Having access to this information sooner would provide Elections NL with valuable data about the services that are provided, and how to shift those services to match the demand that was actually observed. It would also ensure that Elections NL could carry out any enforcement activities with respect to instances of multiple voting in a timely manner.

Without significant and comprehensive changes to the Elections Act, 1991 these modern electoral services cannot be incorporated into Elections NL's operational plan for successive elections. Implementing significant changes to electoral legislation, electoral materials, and equipment, and incorporating technology at scale for a general election is a multi-year and possibly a multi-election cycle project. Resources and feedback will be needed from multiple stakeholders including government officials and committees, election officials, and political parties to fully incorporate these changes. Elections NL is ready to take the next steps towards modernizing electoral services for electors in Newfoundland and Labrador.



BAIE VERTE - GREEN BAY DIVISION MAP**





