**Note 1**

A listing of contributions made to the registered political parties relating to the General Election of November 30, 2015 is included in the annual filing of the Political Parties. This statement details expenditures of the political parties related to the General Election of November 30, 2015. The details of contributions of amounts greater than \$100 are included and listed in a separate supplementary schedule titled "Supplementary Schedule of Contributions from the Annual Report on Election Finances January 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015"

**Note 2**

A registered party's campaign expenditure limit is calculated by multiplying the expense factor for 2015 by the number of persons on the revised list of electors in each of the districts in which the party has a candidate. A registered party contesting all 40 districts would have a campaign expenditure limit of:  
 $360,533 \times \$4.386 \text{ per voter} = \$1,581,298$
